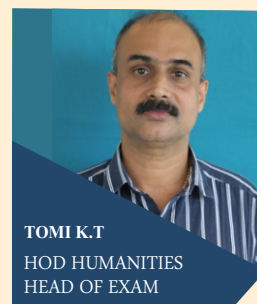

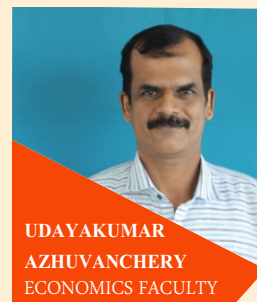

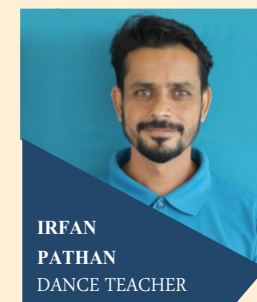

Field Trip to Water Treatment Plant, Sarthana

An educational field trip was organized for the students of grade X to XII to the Water Treatment Plant, Sarthana on 17/10/2022 (Monday). There were 22 students and 4 teachers who visited the plant. The school bus reached the plant at 10:30 am. After completing required permission formalities, the plant official initiated to explain the entire working mechanism of the treatment process.

Water is taken from Tapi river from surface level by a stilling chamber and undergoes pre-chlorination which will kill most of the microbes present in it. Then, the water is allowed to fall from the stair shaped well to clear high density particles and for proper mixing of chlorine gas into water. During the next stage, water will undergo Alum dosing/mixing which will stick macromolecules together to form lumps which can be separated easily from dirty water. Then this water is allowed to pass through 10-12 feet deep Lamella type clarifiers to remove turbidity and to increase its transparency. After that, it passes through rapid gravity sand filters to remove impurities from it. Final stage is post-chlorination. During it, the excess of chlorine is removed from the water and this processed water is stored into big tanks from which the different areas are supplied water as per their prerecorded schedule.

The SMC chemist who was explaining the whole process was very cooperative. The students were very curious and were asking questions frequently. At last, students visited a chemical laboratory which is used to take readings and samples during different processes. They saw various percussion instruments too. The students and teachers had taken a group photo at the end. At last, they departed for school by bus and reached the school back at 12:45pm.

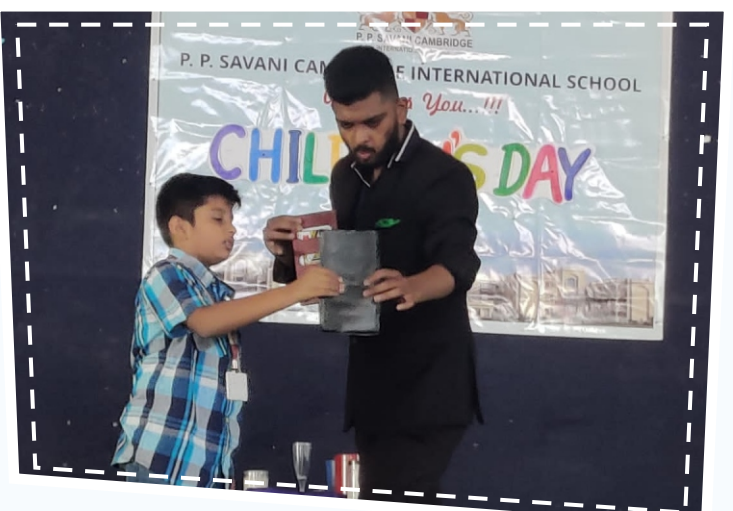

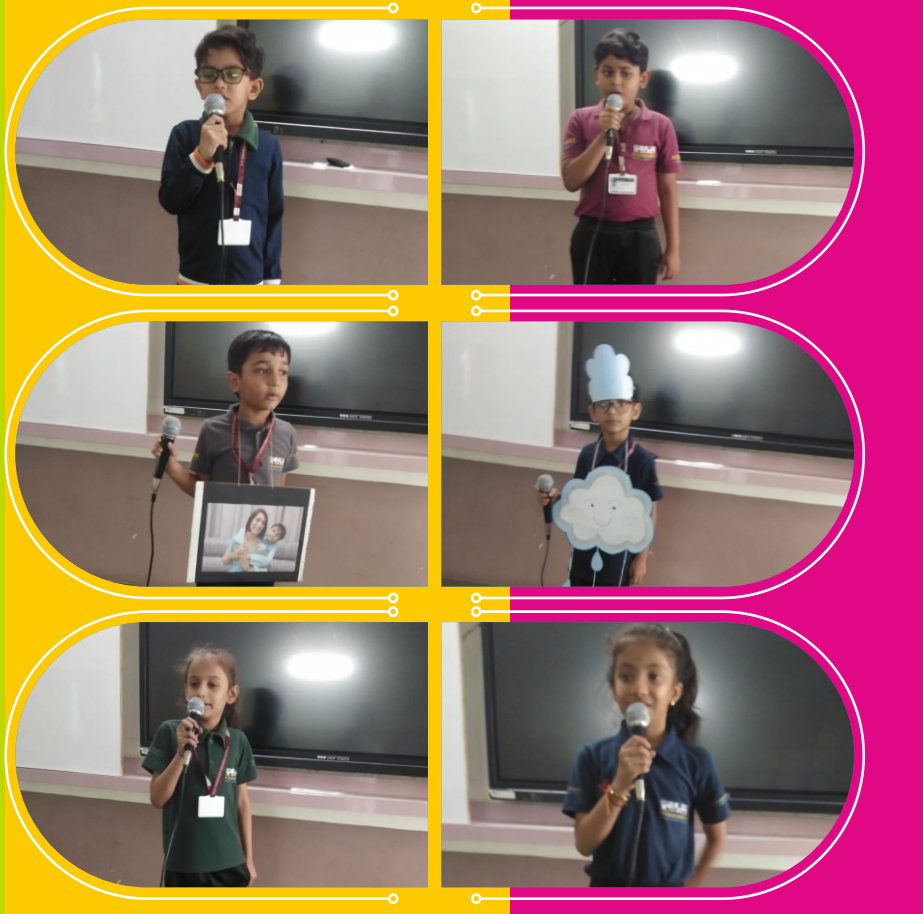

He also spoke at length about the sacrifices he has to make when he works almost round the clock in the lab.

He added how he entertains himself by learning to play tabla and advised everyone to have some hobbies to keep the creative skills burning. Answering questions from the audience, Mr Priyansh said that it was his passion and the desire to contribute something significant to the world that kept him motivated and going despite the hardships. According to some students, this was one of the best talks that they had ever heard. The session came to an end after the principal thanked him for addressing the students with a memento.



Teacher's Training

A productive and fruitful training about the “SENSES” board was held on 27th January, 2023 in P.P Savani Cambridge International School which was attended by all the teachers along with Principal Ma'am. It was about a detailed explanation of using the Senses intelligent interactive panel in the teaching process in various ways. By providing interactive and collaborative learning, smart boards have aided in the transformation of classrooms into active learning environments. The resource person from Senses Mr. Hardik introduced it as an interactive board that is receptive to touch which allows you to write and move things around. It is one of the best technologies that can be used in the classroom in order to increase student engagement during the learning process.

The senses IIP is designed as an integrated unit which has a display, the touch interface, the speakers and inbuilt CPU. The detailed explanation by resource person about some of the key features of Senses IIP included

- Voice recognition
- Cloud based teaching
- Multi-Finger Gesture Control
- Auto email
- Screen recording
- Endless Canvas
- Multi language recognition
- Text/shape recognition
- Different background colours
- Browse the internet
- Formula recognition
- Video and picture play
- Solve graph functions equations and simulate lab experiments and many more.

Meanwhile these all key features were explained in detail one by one. Firstly he explained how we can download any book in the system and save as a pdf or by this one can display the book on the screen and can deliver the lecture by zooming in the text or highlighting the important parts of the text. He explained how this device is fruitful in science, how we can introduce the students with the practical project in 3D, so that students have their own mind map before going to the science lab. Furthermore he explained other subjects related to maths such as how we can deal with different angles, shapes, use of scale or various tools which would be quite easy to understand by the students.

Next he questioned the teachers to ask if anyone had any doubt and some doubts were cleared by the trainer. He shared some beautiful tricks and tips to remember the instructions taught by him. It was also said by the resource person that a WhatsApp group will be created in which every week 10 tasks will be given. Based on the task we have to teach in the class. This will ease the use of this panel which comes loaded with all the bells and whistles necessary for school. It was explained how 'The Senses IIP' technology in the classroom can improve the understanding of your curriculum by making a dull lesson into an exciting interactive experience. It can enable students to learn and explore new concepts using technology to create a more dynamic learning experience.

YLE (Young Learners English) Training

The YLE training was held in P.P Savani Cambridge International School on March 22, which was conducted by Ms. Glyniss Saldhana, Cambridge English Trainer. The training was attended by all the teachers of English Department along with Secondary Head Ms. Anjali Varma and Primary Head Ms. Roopa Shridhar.

Cambridge Young Learners English (YLE) is a suite of English language tests specially designed for children at primary level. The suite includes three qualifications, each targeted at a different level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) published by the Council of Europe, and demonstrate real-life communication.

Starters: Pre-A1 level

Movers: CEFR A1 level

Flyers: CEFR A2 level

The first and foremost concern of that training was to develop the four basic skills LSRW in the learner's personalities. It was suggested that these skills must be prominent by every teacher who teaches English to the learners as well as explained well. Fun games that help build the language and skills young learners need at Pre-A1, A1 and A2 levels, thus providing a 'ladder' to encourage and support progression in language learning steadily up the proficiency continuum.

The trainer notified that the skills covered in this aim to support children to access English-language books, songs, television, films, internet and other media, use English as a common international language, and get ready for future study. Overall, it was a fun learning experience about English.

Cambridge Primary English Introductory Training

A Teacher's Training was organized by CAIE on 10 & 11 November 2022 at JS Global School, Chennai. The keynote speakers were Mr. Jaipal Reddy, Principal, Podar International School, Mumbai and Mr. Keerti Harrit, G.D Goenka School, GGN. The training-workshop was attended by fifteen trainees who came from different states of India and one of our teachers Ms. Anuradha Sharma had attended the same from our school.

The training-workshop was started by Mr. Jaipal Reddy by welcoming the participants, asking participants and trainers to introduce themselves, and establishing the ground rules. He explained how to use the School Support Hub, how it helps us to explore techniques of teaching in Cambridge by going through the past papers, marks scheme endorsed resources, coursework training programmes and how one can get the solution of any query by the online forum and also discussed the progression papers. He suggested that 120-150 hours would be required in each stage for teaching.

Next Speaker shared knowledge that the previous version (0844) will be effective till December 2022, so it was suggested to download all papers from the website. After which version (0058) would be only accessible.

An activity named as (RICER) was conducted at first day in which all trainees were distributed in groups and speaker explained how Responsible, Innovative, Confident, Engage and Reflective one should be in teaching, he explained how feedbacks are better than marks and what kind of provoking questions should be asked to learners rather than open and closed questions and explained how to generate metacognition skills in learner's personality in every subject. Bloom's taxonomy was also discussed.

Micro teaching activity was conducted in groups in which everyone had to play the role of a

teacher, an observer and learners by this we could understand the demonstration of the teaching approaches covered during the training and could have done the practice teaching using the Cambridge curriculum, put the lesson plan into action and we could evaluate our own and our peer's micro-teaching as well. Check point exam and marking scheme was explained in detail and also shared that how one can become a Cambridge trainer. The training got over after the online feedback form which was provided by the speaker.

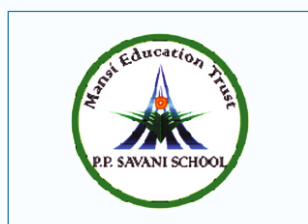
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
