GRADE	HOLIDAY HOMEWORK
GRADE I	 ALPHABET SCRAPBOOK Students have to make a scrapbook of alphabets (A to Z). They have to stick 3 pictures and write its name starting with the alphabet. This project helps reinforce letter recognition and early literacy skills.
GRADE II	 <u>COLOUR SCRAPBOOK</u> Students have to make a scrapbook showing 10 different colours. They have to stick 3 pictures of a particular colour and write its name. This project helps in colour recognition and identification of objects in real life.
GRADE III	 <u>CREATIVITY WITH CRAFTS</u> Students have to make 3 different handmade crafts. The crafts can be lantern, bangles, lampshade, toran, candles, pen stand etc. This project will foster creativity among students.

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GRADE IV	 <u>EMOTICONS SCRAPBOOK</u> Students have to write about 3 different emotions they have experienced in the summer break with their friends or family Each student will paste one photo with emoji with their friends, family or neighbourhood and write about the incident describing the emotion. This project will encourage students to share their thoughts and enhance mental wellbeing
GRADE V & VI	 <u>BEST OUT OF WASTE</u> Students have to make 3 different products out of waste Each student can make products using old newspapers into papier-mâché bowls or transforming plastic bottles into planters, the possibilities are endless! This project will foster creativity among students and makes them aware about saving the earth by reducing, reusing or recycling the product.
GRADE VII	 <u>TRAVELOGUE</u> Students have to make a travelogue to write about their travels into cherished memories by creating a travel scrapbook. Each student has to stick a photo of their memory and describe the moment in their own words. Students can also stick tickets, postcards and even pressed flowers. This project will enhance writing skills and help them to know detailed information about the places they visit.
GRADE VIII	 <u>STORY WRITING</u> Students have to write a fiction story of about 300 words. The story can be related to your dream of epic quests in distant lands, thrilling mysteries waiting to be solved, or heartwarming tales of friendship and courage, the power of your imagination knows no bounds! This project will enhance creativity and writing skills and help them to think beyond their imagination.
GRADE IX	 <u>VISUALIZATION BOARD</u> Students have to create their visualization board to achieve their goals 5 years down the line. Students have to take some time to reflect on their aspirations, interests, and areas for growth and then write the set of objectives to achieve a particular goal. Each students has to write 3 different achievable goals in time line of 5 years. Your timeline visualization board can include milestones, deadlines, and checkpoints to keep you on track and motivated



	 throughout the summer. Whether it's learning a new language, mastering a musical instrument, or starting a passion project, let your creativity shine as you design your roadmap to success! This project will help students to see life with a whole new perspective and prepare them for the unknown.
GRADE X	 <u>PICTURE WRITING</u> Students have to write a story of about 500 words using 10 pictures. Your mission, should you choose to accept it, is to venture out into the world with your camera in hand and capture a moment that sparks your imagination.Whether it's a breathtaking landscape, a candid moment with friends, or a hidden gem waiting to be discovered, the possibilities are endless!
