The rangoli should include at least 3 geometric shapes (like triangles, circles, hexagons, or symmetric patterns).• Suggest 2 eco-friendly ideas to reduce pollution during Diwali.• Write a short story, poem, or personal diary entry on the theme: <i>"My Dream Eco-Friendly Diwali"</i>.
IX & X	<p><u>Task</u>: Create a poster, scrapbook, OR digital presentation (students may choose format).</p> <p><u>Diwali & Local Economy</u> - Interview/observe at least 2 small shops/vendors and note how their sales change during Diwali.</p>
XI & XII	<p><u>Task</u>: Choose any one (a book, a movie, or a documentary) that highlights themes of hope, victory, resilience, or light over</p>

	<p>darkness.</p> <p><u>Format:</u> A written reflection (250–300 words) on A4 sheets.</p> <p><u>Parameters:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Title & author/ director.2. Brief synopsis/ overview.3. Key theme/ message that connects with <i>light over darkness</i> or <i>festivals of hope</i>.4. Your personal reflection: What did you learn and why would you recommend it?

1. Diwali Project will be assessed for subject enrichment activity.
2. The project should be submitted to the class teacher latest by 05/11/2025.
3. The assignment should be done as per the directions given above.

VI, VII & VIII

- Draw your rangoli neatly and label the geometric shapes used.
- Write eco-friendly ideas and your story/poem in clear handwriting, with a suitable title.

IX & X

- Use visuals, charts, or photos in your poster/scrapbook/presentation to make it engaging.
- Record real observations by interacting with shopkeepers and present them in a creative format. You may also include photographs of the vendors

XI & XII

- Keep your reflection original and within 250–300 words on A4 sheets.
- Highlight how the theme relates to “light over darkness” and add your personal perspective.
