It reinforced the school's commitment to holistic development by nurturing respect for traditions while fostering joy, unity and enthusiasm among students.




Kisna Nature Park Visit

A joyful Night-Out was organised on 13th February 2026 at P.P. Savani Cambridge International School for the students of Nursery to Grade 2.


